# Pastor's Ponderings

What a great day Saturday the 18th of October was. My heartfelt thanks to everyone involved in any way, shape, or form. I won't start naming names, I don't want anyone to feel left out. It was a huge day and very successful in so many ways. It evidenced just how much we are part of our community. The support from Dayboro and beyond with actors and dancers made me very proud. And there were so many people from outside the congregation in attendance. You don't get that level of support without good relationships, and a good reputation, in your community.

The easy option for us would have been to dedicate a Sunday morning service to the 125-year celebration, perhaps with a guest minister, and a shared lunch & of course a fancy 125 anniversary cake. But opting for the easy option isn't our way. Taking "A Walk Through the Decades in Theatre and Song" in two performances was ambitious and a joy to be involved in. Providing a sausage sizzle lunch and a high tea style afternoon tea following the two free performances was part of our gift back to a people that see us as very much part of this community.

In the break between the two performances, I sat and wondered if John Bond & William Nugent (my great grandfather) could ever have imagined that one day they would be portrayed in a drama marking such an anniversary. I doubt it somehow; there was never any talk about the fact William had donated land for the church when the family spoke of the "old days". I guess it was just something he did in a humble way for his congregation and perhaps never spoke of again. Yet, there we were remembering them & their role in our church's history a little over 125 years later.

This train of thought in turn led me to wondering just where the church might be in 50 years, or even in just 25 years. What changes may have happened? Will it be something we would recognise as familiar, or will future leadership take us in a new direction? I wonder if Uniting Church Dayboro will still be a church not just geographically in the heart of Dayboro, but also metaphorically in the heart of Dayboro. Being in the heart of a community doesn't happen accidentally. Well done Uniting Church Dayboro.

#### Still the best-seller, but how is it used?

I was wondering if the Bible had been knocked out of #1 position as the most read and sold book in the world, so I checked. No, nothing has changed. Yet, I don't know too many people who buy Bibles and read them, even in the social circles I move in. However, for Christian churches, the Bible is one thing we all have in common. We hold it in a special place, a place we call holy, even though we may use its contents in different ways.

My son, who is a journalist and radio producer, and also an occasional preacher, used an interesting analogy about his relationship with the Bible. As he is under 40, whereas I'm much older, I thought it was worth sharing with you. He said 'One of my favourite stories from the Bible is the one about Jacob wrestling with God. While travelling back to Canaan, Jacob encounters a stranger on the road. They fight, and Jacob wrestles with the man all night. For hours and hours, neither can best the other, and as the sun begins to rise the stranger says "Please! Release me!" But Jacob says, I WILL NOT LET YOU GO UNTIL YOU BLESS ME. Jacob leaves that encounter wounded — and transformed. That's what reading the Bible is like, to me."

If you have read the Bible, and I mean really read it, not just the sanitised verses picked out for weekly preaching, you will know that sometimes it makes us uncomfortable, even horrifies us, puzzles us and challenges us. It is, of course not one book, but a collection of writings from different eras and authorships, different cultural settings, of different genres and different languages. What each of us reads may have passed through multiple attempts at translation, yet somehow, God through the Bible, continues to speak to us, inspire us and guide us thousands of years later.

Some say that the Bible is the word of God. The great author, C.S. Lewis disagrees. He says "It is Christ Himself, not the Bible, who is the true word of God. The Bible, read in the right spirit and with the guidance of good teachers, will bring us to Him. We must not use the Bible as a sort of encyclopaedia out of which texts can be taken for use as weapons."

So, let's not use our sacred text to wound people and divide one another. God's truths are not bricks to throw at one another. They are bread to feed us.
